Focus 1: The Rights of Women and Girls

SUPPORT FOR 128 FEMALE STUDENTS' EDUCATION IN ENUGU STATE, NIGERIA FUNDED BY MUNDO COOPERANTE OF SPAIN SEPTEMBER 2022 - APRIL 2023

"The Right to be a Girl" - Projects to end Girl Child marriage is a project WINET is executing to support young girls' retention in school, so as not to fall victim of girlchild marriage. Under the project, one hundred and twenty-eight (128) female students in Enugu State Nigeria have received Scholarship for one academic session (2022–2023). They include one hundred and six (106) female students of Comprehensive Secondary School Akpasha, and twenty-two (22) female students of Community Secondary School, Iva-Valley Enugu.

In addition to the scholarship, the girls received notebooks, school bags, Mathematical sets and other writing materials. The deputy Senior Prefect of CSS Akpasha, Miss Faith Nwachukwu, on behalf of others, thanked WINET and Mundo for supporting their education, thereby shielding them from being targets for Girl-Child Marriage. She promised that they will study hard to make their sponsors proud. Mundo is currently supporting activities by WINET for the fourth year since 2019.

BUDGET ADVOCACY TO END CHILD MARRIAGE IN TWO LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS IN ENUGU STATE

In an effort to sustain the campaign against girl-child marriage, WINET with support from Girls Not Brides, carried out a project titled "Budget Advocacy to End Child Marriage in Two Local Government Areas in Enugu State". The Local Government Areas are Aninri and Enugu South where we led advocacy to both Chairmen to support increased budget line for interventions to end child marriage by keeping girls in school and provision of good healthcare services; Forty (40) budget staff, 28 females and 12 males of the two local governments were trained on how to prepare budgets to promote girl-child retention in school; One-day dialogue on ending girl-child marriage was held with 30 women of Ovoko Community, in Igbo-Eze South Local Government Area and a media roundtable was held with 10 journalists, (1 female and 9 males) to support ending girl-child marriage in Enugu State.

STUDY ON ASSESSING THE EXTENT OF INCLUSION OF WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP BY TRADITIONAL RULERS IN SIX COMMUNITIES IN ENUGU STATE, NIGERIA BETWEEN 2010 AND 2021

In order to contibute to available literature on women's inclusion in leadership in Nigeria, WINET received support from the Nigerian Women Trust Fund (NWTF) to assess the extent of inclusion of women in leadership in six Communities in Enugu State. The Communities are Obige-Obukpa and Breme-Ehandiagu in Enugu North Senatorial Zone, Mbulu-Owo and Umueze in Enugu East Senatorial Zone and Alum-Inyi and Ezema-Olo in Enugu West Senatorial Zone.

Findings from the study show that:

- To a very large extent, advocacies thus far, have influenced women's inclusion in leadership and decision making by traditional rulers in Communities in Enugu State since 2010.
- The communities do not have the legal framework to include women in Cabinets but their Constitutions are gender neutral and accomodates inclusion of women.

Summary of findings

- 80% of the respondents wish their traditional rulers included women in their cabinets, indicating overwhelming support of the respondents for women's participation in decision making in the traditional cabinets.
- Almost 60% of the respondents believed campaigns and sensitizations positively influenced their support for women to be included in their Igwes' cabinet.
- When disaggregated by gender, about 93% of the female respondents and 82% of the male respondents support constitutional provisions for and protection of the rights of women to be members of their Igwes' cabinets.
- Both male and female respondents were almost equally (about 45%) influenced by the sensitizations and campaigns for women to be included in traditional rulers' councils.

On the dissemination of the report in Nigeria, 16 persons comprising 15 representatives of CSOs and a journalist attended the public presentation event in Enugu; it has received 141 Views and 14 Downloads on <u>www.feministhub.org</u> as at December 2022. Over 150 individuals and organizations have received hardcopies of the report.

Focus 2: Sexual and Gender Based Violence

SUSTAINED ENLIGHTENMENT CAMPAIGN TO END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS AND SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (SGBV) IN ENUGU STATE SUPPORTED BY ACTIONAID NIGERIA UNDER WOMEN'S VOICE AND LEADERSHIP NIGERIA (WVL-N) PROJECT, FUNDED BY GLOBAL AFFAIRS CANADA

The project, now in its 4th year, included massive media campaigns messages and interactive programmes on Radio, town hall meetings and Community dialogues to end SGBV in Enugu State. Activities in 2022 included 3-Day Residential Comprehensive Training for Women Peer Facilitators on the use of the ActionAid Nigeria Peer Education Manual & sensitization on provisions of Enugu State Violence Against Persons (Prohibition) (VAAP) Law (2019) for women groups in Ugwuaji and Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu Communities. The training was to empower women through transfer of knowledge and skills necessary for self-development and enhance their ability to mobilize and organize for collective actions. Topics covered included personal development, livelihood, family and community relationships, well-being, rights and responsibilities, inclusion, hygiene and nutrition.

In Ugwuaji Community, Enugu South Local Government Area, the participating women groups are Umuaro Women Welfare Association and Umuagulu Women Forum, while in Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu Community, the groups are Ugwu Nwanyi Bu Di Women and Nma Nwanyi Bu Di. The peer educators are using contents of the Manual to train others in their groups/associations meetings to understand some cultural, personal situation or conditions in their lives and communities. They have learnt to improve on their relationships as members of groups, following what they learnt on Interpersonal Relationships. The Umuaro Women Welfare Association Savings and Loans microcredit facility is becoming stronger with more women borrowing money to boost their businesses and farming. The women are putting into action what they learnt to enhance their well-being and lead changes in their communities.

In Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu, Nkanu-West Local Government Area, the women are asserting themselves to support community growth. Due to issues of adolescent's misbehavior and with the approval of the Traditional Ruler, HRH Igwe Ignatius Ogbodo Ugwu, the women have formed "Amagu Women Peace and Security Committee", to monitor activities in the market from 7.30pm to 10pm when the market closes. The Committee is to hand over to the community vigilante and Police for prosecution, those engaged in illegal acts in the market. The women have established a communication channel with the Traditional Ruler which has enabled them to discuss their concerns with him and his cabinet. One issue which they have presented to the Traditional Ruler is the urgent need to include women in the Igwe's Cabinet. Eighty (80) women are benefitting in both project Communities.

Reports of SGBV Cases to WINET

WINET has an electronic data base of SGBV cases it received and referred to WVL-N partners for further action.

Media Campaigns on Ending SGBV

Through our interactive programmes and dissemination of WVL-N jingles and fliers on ending Violence Against Women and Girls and Sexual and Gender-Based Violence, as well as support for women's political participation broadcast on Urban Radio, Dream Fm and Energy Fm about two point five million (2,500,000) radio listeners received the information in Enugu State.

Focus 3: The Rights of Persons with Disabilities

HUMAN AND DISABILITY RIGHTS EDUCATION FOR WOMEN WITH DISABILITIES IN ENUGU STATE, NIGERIA SUPPORTED BY AFRICAN WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT FUND (AWDF) 1ST FEBRUARY 2021 – 31ST JANUARY 2022

Activities of the project culminated in the dissemination of an endline research report to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and the media. It determined what changed in the lives of female PWDs, who were empowered with information on their human rights and procedure for enforcement.

Findings showed that the level of understanding of fundamental rights; basic concept of human rights, violation of rights and how to remedy them by Women with Disabilities (WWDs) in Enugu State improved as a result of the training. Significant changes were recorded in the percentage of the WWDs with adequate knowledge before the training, to those who have such after the training. The aggregated scores of the WWDs' knowledge of fundamental rights, rights against discrimination, rights violation, procedures for remedying these violations and the attendant penalties increased from an average of 20.2% before the training to about 59.8% after the training (about 40% increase). Scores showed that the ability to report cases of rights violation to appropriate authorities has increased among the WWDs. For this reason, the number of WWDs that are approaching the appropriate authorities for redress after the training has significantly increased. Eighty-four (84) women with disabilities benefitted from the training.

Outcome: An outcome of the project is the formation of PWD Women Rights Forum in Enugu State. On 3rd March 2022, the group led advocacy to the Speaker Enugu State

House of Assembly, The Right Honourable Edward Ubosi for the adoption of the Discrimination Against Persons with Disabilities (Prohibition) Act 2018 in Enugu State.

Focus 4: ENGAGEMENT IN PARTNERSHIPS, COALITIONS AND NETWORKS

WINET is maintaining its partnerships with other organizations and membership of Coalitions and Networks. This is to ensure greater effectiveness in its work through engagements in its core area of business.
