As part of efforts to end child marriage, three hundred and thirty-eight (338) school girls in Enugu State were sustained in school thorough our scholarship scheme, supported by Mundo Cooperante.

We disseminated information through the media on ending Sexual and Gender Based Violence, while through peer education circle, women in three project Communities in Enugu State mobilized, organized and took joint action for their well-being. This project was supported by ActionAid Nigeria in partnership with Global Affairs Canada.

WHO WE ARE

Women Information Network (WINET) is a women's rights, women led, media focused, non-governmental and non-profit organization, working to promote and protect the rights of women, girls and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). WINET is registered with Corporate Affairs Commission Nigeria in 2002 with registration number RC:14892 and belongs to many networks. It is also registered with the Federal Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Development Abuja and Enugu State Ministry of Children, Gender Affairs and Social Development. WINET is an organization in Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) since 2020.

We provide them with information on the procedure for enforcement of their rights and create awareness to prevent and end sexual and gender based violence and other harmful practices including girl-child/Forced marriage and Female Genital Cutting/Mutilation. We disseminate information to promote the sexual reproductive health and rights of women and girls

and empower them with information that will enable them to make informed decisions.

FOCUS 1: THE RIGHTS OF WOMEN, GIRLS AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

SUPPORT FOR 338 FEMALE STUDENTS' EDUCATION IN ENUGU STATE, NIGERIA FUNDED BY MUNDO COOPERANTE OF SPAIN SEPTEMBER 2023 – May 2024

Under the 5th edition of the project "The Right to be a Girl" - Projects working to end Girl-Child marriage, titled Support for Female Students Education and Scholarship for Girls Education in Enugu State Nigeria, three hundred and thirty-eight (338) indigent female students benefitted. They include one hundred and six (106) female students of Comprehensive Secondary School Akpasha, and twenty-two (22) female students of Community Secondary School, Iva-Valley. Students of three additional secondary schools benefitted from the scholarship for 3rd term only; they are sixty-nine (69) female students of Community Secondary School Ejuona Obukpa, thirty-seven (37) female students of Community Secondary school Obele-Agu Umana and one hundred and four (104) students of Community Secondary School Obollo-Eke. One student with disability of Community Secondary School, Ejuona Obukpa benefitted because there are few students with Disabilities in the schools.

The project is to support young girls' retention in school, so that they will not be vulnerable to girl-child marriage. Their school fees were paid and they were provided with school bags, notebooks, Mathematical sets and other writing materials.

FOCUS 2: SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (SGBV)

SUSTAINED ENLIGHTENMENT CAMPAIGN TO END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN & GIRLS AND SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (SGBV) IN ENUGU STATE SUPPORTED BY ACTIONAID NIGERIA UNDER WOMEN'S VOICE AND LEADERSHIP NIGERIA (WVL-N) PROJECT, FUNDED BY GLOBAL AFFAIRS CANADA

The project, which started in 2019 and in its 5th year in 2024, focused on preventing SGBV in Enugu State. The sustainability close-out activities included town hall meetings to get the support of men in continuing the peer education after the project exit. The women peer facilitators from three project communities of Ugwuaji, Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu and Umuatugbuoma in Enugu State used the ActionAid Training manual to train their members to understand some cultural, personal situation or conditions that adversely affect their lives and communities. The Traditional Rulers of Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu Community, HRH Igwe Ignatius Ugwu and the Onowu of Ugwuaji Community, Dennis Ani pledged their community's support for the Women Peer Education Programme.

RESULTS/SUCCESS STORIES FROM THE WVL-N PEER EDUCATION PROJECT

Here are results of the Peer learning in Enugu State, led by WINET in partnership with ActionAid Nigeria, as part of the Women's Voice and Leadership Nigeria (WVL-N) project funded by Global Affairs Canada. 2024 marked 5 years of WINET partnership with ActionAid Nigeria.

WINET/ActionAid Nigeria Peer Education Programme brought positive changes to the lives of over one hundred and twenty women participants in Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu, Ugwuaji and Umuatugbuoma Communities in Enugu State, Nigeria. Using the ActionAid Nigeria Women Peer Education Manual, the facilitators empowered members of their associations with knowledge and skills necessary for self-development and enhanced ability to mobilize and organize for collective action. They were trained to tackle issues that retard development in their Communities. The Peer learning responded to obvious capacity gaps and needs of women to lead and make their voices heard.

Testimonies from the women attest to this: Mrs. Helen Ude said "For the first time in our Community, Umuatugbuoma, members of the women peer learning group visited the Traditional Ruler, Igwe Okechukwu Nwobodo to request for the inclusion of women in the Igwe's Cabinet".

Mrs Ngozi Ugwu of Ugwuaji said "I learnt that being a woman is valuable as no woman is inferior to another woman or a man. I no longer hide at the back, I can speak boldly in meetings or at any gathering." She continues, "That is why I am standing here to testify to the impact of the peer education circle brought by WINET and ActionAid Nigeria".

Mrs. Bridget Ogbodo, fifty-nine year- old widow, and mother of four started a business of selling fufu to generate income. Bridget Ogbodo, of Umuatugbuoma Community expressed joy on learning the importance of generating one's own income and exclaimed, "The Peer education brought by WINET to our Community is a blessing to me".

According to Mrs. Onyekachi Uchendu-Nwunna, she learnt that women can own a business and make some money for themselves, improve their looks and feed their families better. She learnt that one can start a business with little amount of money so she started making soya milk. She said "Thank you WINET and AAN", I now own a business and earn income to support my family".

Madam Rita Ani said that in their Community Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu, "Our women have opened a communication channel with the Traditional Ruler, whereby we interact with him to share our concerns on issues affecting us".

Following reports and incidences of abuse and assault on children and teenagers in the Ugwuanyiovu Market area in Amagu Akegbe –Ugwu at night, the Traditional Rulers council issued a proclamation banning teenagers and children from being in the market from 7.00pm to 6:00am. This is to check harassment of girls in the market.

Inclusion of Women in Leadership:

There is increased awareness among women on the issue of inclusion of women, in leadership & decision making in the Community and they are advocating for it with Traditional Leaders and men.

Working as a group:

Women in Ugwuaji, Amagu Akegbe-Ugwu & Umuatugbuoma have learnt to mobilize, organize and take collective actions on issues that affect their lives politically, culturally, socially and economically, while bringing changes to their Communities. They meet with the Traditional Ruler and men to present issues of concern to women and girls.

NATIONAL COALITION OF CIVIL SOCIETY TO END CHILD MARRIAGE IN NIGERIA BEGINS PROJECT TO END CHILD MARRIAGE IN THREE COMMUNITIES IN ENUGU STATE

The National Coalition of Civil Society organizations to End Child Marriage (ECM-CSO) in Nigeria organized a two-day workshop to foster the development, improvement and implementation of community Bye-laws to end child marriage in selected communities in the state. It was held in Enugu on $16^{th} - 17^{th}$ October, 2024. Coalition members, Women Information Network (WINET), Divine Era Development and Social Rights Initiative (DEDASRI) and Society for the Improvement of Rural People (SIRP) were in attendance. Two National members from Abuja Chapter, Oluchi Achi-Uzodinma Executive Director of Child Shield Initiative and Henry Panaam of Child and Youth Protection Foundation as well as stakeholders from project Communities of Akwuke, Ekpulato Mgbowo, and Umuatugbuoma participated in the training.
